

Perfect Storm 2.0 INSTRUCTIONS

Model Number: 5724244

1. Plug your **Perfect Storm 2.0** control unit into any 15 amp. 120 volt outlet.
2. Plug the lights you are going to use into the back of the **Perfect Storm 2.0** control unit.
3. Note: It is important the total lights you are using **DO NOT** exceed more than 1000 watts of power. If you do exceed this load amount, a reset fuse in the back of the **Perfect Storm 2.0** control unit will trip. Should this happen, reduce the amount of lights being controlled, and then press the reset button on the back of your Perfect Storm 2.0 control unit.
4. Use the included Thunder Sounds CD or place whatever sound effect you wish to use into your CD or tape player, MP3 player, your smart phone, etc. Now you have two options:
 - 1) Place one speaker next to the front of your **Perfect Storm 2.0** control unit, next to the external microphone. If you are using a stereo system, then your other speaker can be placed across the room, or even outside, with the sound on that speaker at a higher volume.
 - 2) Connect the CD player audio line-out (through RCA-to-3.5mm jack cable, not included), MP3 player and cell phone (through 3.5mm to 3.5mm jacks cable, not included) to the **Perfect Storm 2.0** audio input jack. If there is an audio line in input connected to the 3.5mm audio input jack, then disable the external microphone input. Then the **Perfect Storm 2.0** will control the lights by the audio line with music from your CD player, MP3 player or cell phone, etc.
5. Turn on your **Perfect Storm 2.0** control unit, using the red switch on the front of your unit. Note that the switch will light up as soon as it has power.
6. Adjust the volume on your CD, tape player, MP3 player or cell phone to a moderate volume, and play your sound track.
7. Adjust the sensor, which is a round knob on the front of your **Perfect Storm 2.0** control unit to make your lights flash to your liking. Remember, you can use your **Perfect Storm 2.0** to control lights with other music or party CD's.
